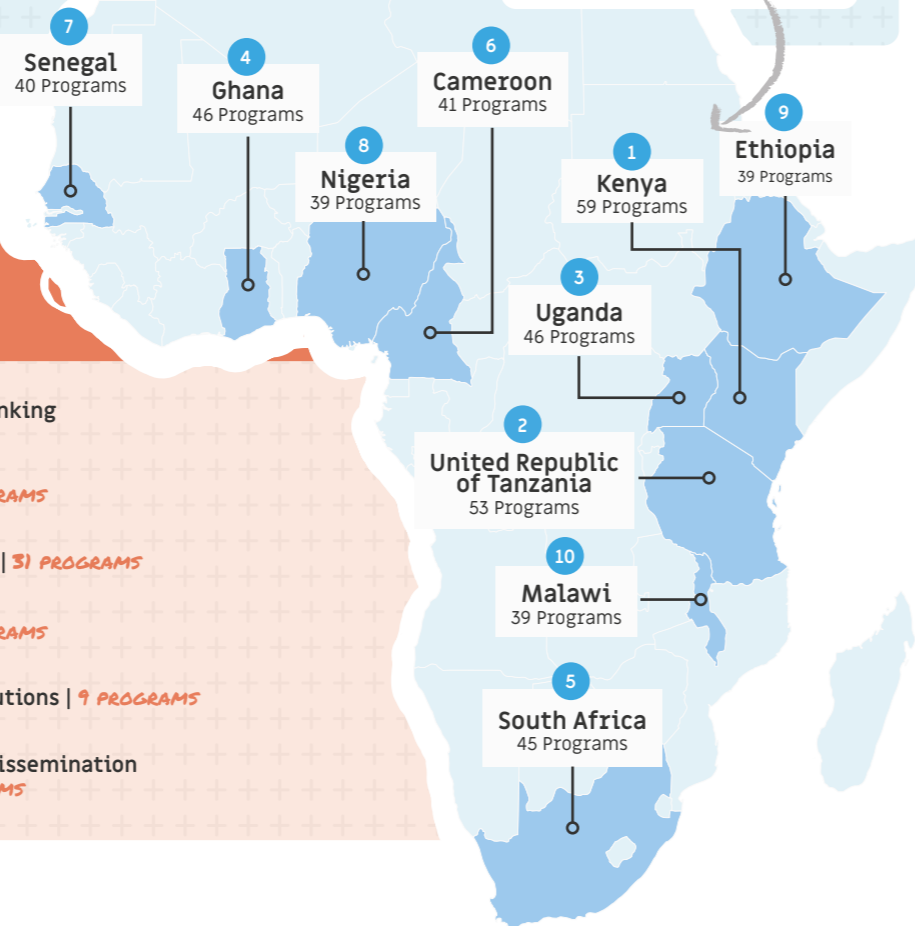


As Africa's population continues to grow, it is estimated to reach **2.5 billion people by 2050**, investments in robust health systems are key to inclusive and sustainable growth.
